Falls Can Be Catastrophic for Older Adults

Falls are the leading cause of hospital admissions in Cumbria, placing pressure on both care staff and the National Health Service (NHS). According to statistics, **25** percent of falls result in hospitalization, with **20** percent categorized as "long-lie falls." Regarding the latter, 50 percent of older individuals who remain on the floor for over one hour after a fall die within six months.

Prompt assistance following a fall is crucial not only for preserving quality of life but also for significantly reducing hospital stays and alleviating the burden on care staff.

Already known for its diligent fall data collection and reporting, Hartland House was selected by the local Integrated Care Board (ICB) for a pilot project using new Artificial-Intelligence-based technology to improve fall prevention and detection inside the facility.

Nobi Smart Lamp Enables Real-Time Fall Detection

Combining state-of-the-art AI with smartsensor technology, the Nobi Smart Lamp was seamlessly integrated into the Hartland House infrastructure, including lamp placements in residents' rooms to ensure real-time fall detection and fast response without compromising comfort or privacy.

Further, Nobi incorporates proactive fall prevention, such as automatic lighting triggered when residents leave their beds at night to reduce the risk of falls in low-light conditions. Because the lamps also send care staff notifications when residents get in or out of bed, workers can proactively provide assistance to help prevent falls.
